Team Members

ZooQuest teams must consist of at least 2 (one child, one adult), but no more than 5 (two adults, 3 children) players. It is up to you as to whether or not your team will consist of 2, 3, 4, or 5 players. Maybe your brain works better with 3 others or you're more compatible with just one. No matter what, we make no guarantees as to which team size works best. Children must be between 1st and 6th grade. The adult(s) must be the parent or legal guardian of the child(ren) participating in the program.

Team Names

Team names, though not mandatory, are a fun and unique way to express your team's individuality and creativity. They can show your Zoo spirit or simply be a fun joke for you. If you choose to have a team name, please provide it when you register so that your team materials will reflect it. The first team to register a specific team name will get it. Please ensure all names are family friendly.

Refunds/Cancellations/Team Changes

Unless a cancellation is announced by the Zoo, all events are rain or shine, so make sure you are there and dressed appropriately for the weather! If for some reason you need to cancel or make changes to your team, please provide two weeks notice. A refund less an \$8 processing fee will be issued if your cancellation is received no later than two weeks prior to the date of the program. No refunds will be issued without at least two weeks notice of cancellation. An \$8 processing fee will be charged for all transfers.

Parking

Each team is responsible for their own parking, and may we suggest carpooling? Please allow 15 minutes prior to the program start time in order to park or drop off participants. Parking and Drop-off Options include: Zoo's parking lots for a fee (Zoo Friends members can use their free parking benefit) or free parking on streets around the Zoo.

Outfits/Costumes

While you may want to have team t-shirts or uniforms, keep in mind that costumes will not be permitted and it may be difficult to determine where to draw the line. Always remember the environment we'll be in and keep all designs family appropriate.
