Registration Information

Advance registration is required for all programs. Registrations close two weeks prior to the program date or when the program is sold out.

Zoo members receive priority online registration and a discount on program fees. If you would like to become a member or renew your membership, please visit stlzoo.org/membership or call (314) 646-4771, option 2 for more information.

Choose between:

- Online Registration (available on the Saint Louis Zoo's website). Priority will be given to online registrants. Online registration will open for Zoo members on March 3, 2020, at 9 a.m., and for general public on March 4, 2020, at 2 p.m. Please visit stlzoo.org for detailed information on how to register online.
- Mail-in/drop-off Registration Forms. All mail-in/drop-off registrations must be received by 4 p.m. on Monday, March 2, 2020, and will be processed on or after March 4. Any registrations received after March 2 will be processed in the order received.
- For mail-in/drop-off registration, you must complete the following:
 - › Camp Registration and Health/Information Form for Camp Joey, Camp KangaZoo, Teen Camp and Specialty Camps
 - › Individual Registration Form for all other programs.

NOTE:

- Fax, email and phone registrations are not accepted.
- Participants must be the appropriate age or grade level and can only register for one session of each camp topic or program title.
- Processing fees will apply for duplicate registrations, cancellations and/or transfers.

Who Can I Register?

Whether you choose online or mail-in registration, you can register:

- Yourself
- Immediate family members residing in the same household (spouse and children)
- Grandchildren (as general public registration or as part of your membership if you have a Family/Grandparent membership level or above)

NOTE: Zoo members are not eligible to register nieces, nephews, friends, neighbors, out-of-town guests, etc. Extended family members, friends, neighbors and out-of-town guests must register themselves and their household members separately.

Buddy Registrations

We offer "buddy" registration for our Camp Joey, Camp KangaZoo and Teen Camp programs for mailed-in forms only. Listing a buddy during online registration does NOT guarantee that they will be together. It is only a request that can be fulfilled IF both children register themselves for the same Camp session. Mail-in or Drop-off Registrations

Mail-in or drop off registrations will be processed on or after March 4, 2020. Before mailing or dropping off your envelope, check to make sure it includes the following (any missing information may delay your registration while we attempt to contact you):

1. Completed registration form(s)
 - All membership, household and participant information.
 - Original signature(s) on the Terms and Conditions of each adult participant and the parent/legal guardian for participants under the age of 18.
2. Complete Payment
 - Credit card or Saint Louis Zoo gift card information and signature.
 - Check – A SEPARATE CHECK is required for each program. A fee will be assessed for any checks returned due to insufficient funds. All checks should be made payable to “Saint Louis Zoo Education Department.” Please write your phone number on your check.

3. ONE buddy may be included for all Camp Programs. Please refer to the Buddy Registration section on the website.

NOTE: We reserve the right to cancel programs due to low enrollment or extenuating circumstances. Full refunds will be issued.

Wait List

During the processing of your mail-in form, you will be placed on the wait list(s) if ALL of your session choices for a requested program are sold out. If you are placed on a wait list, we will not process your payment for that program. We will notify you if an opening occurs.

Cancellations

We require at least two weeks' notice for refund requests. Please notify the Education Department as soon as possible at (314) 646-4544, #6. Cancellation fees apply as follows:

- Camp Joey, Camp KangaZoo, Teen Camp and Specialty Camps – Fee: \$25
- KangaCare and all other programs – Fee: \$8
- Less than two weeks' notice - no refund

Participants may not make up or receive a refund for missed programs.

Transfers

Transfers are subject to availability. Please notify the Education Department at least two weeks before the program session. Transfer fees apply and are due at the time of your request.

Medication Authorization Policy

If your child needs to take medication during Zoo program hours (including insulin and/or an insulin pump), you must complete the Zoo's medication form. Please also complete the FARE's Food Allergy and Anaphylaxis Emergency Care Plan if applicable. Complete medication information is required before your child attends their Zoo program. All medication forms can be found on the Zoo's website. Parking for Programs

Parking is available on the Zoo's North Lot on Government Drive and South Lot on Wells Drive for a fee. Members can use their free parking benefits. Limited free street parking is available. Visit stlzoo.org for parking details and pricing.

Congestion on streets in Forest Park can cause a delay in your arrival time. Please plan extra time so that you arrive on time for your program. For all Camp programs, specific parking/drop-off information will be included in the camp packet or on the Registration Report.

Zoo Policy

Children under the age of 14 must be accompanied by an adult. Parents of children under the age of 14, please plan to escort your child to class and then pick them up when their program is over. You will be asked to sign your child "in" and "out" before and after programs. All program participants will be accompanied by Zoo staff and/or Zoo volunteers during their program.

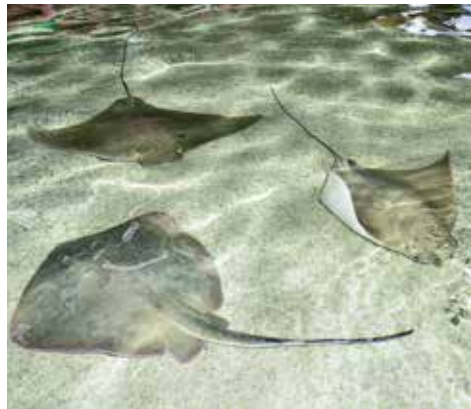
